- Oral. Head and Neck Cancer Awareness® (OHANCA®): In this flagship program, HNCA partners with medical and dental clinics worldwide to offer FREE screenings and awareness programs in their local communities. When detected at stages 1 and 2. the survival rate is over 80%; however. more than half of all cases are found at later stages. When caught at a later stage, survival is less and side effects of treatment are much more significant. This is why early detection is so important.
- Move-A-Thon: Held during April, as part of Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness Month, this national fundraising event encourages people to MOVE while raising funds and awareness.

- Patient Education Programs: Our education initiatives are designed to empower patients, caregivers, and survivors with comprehensive knowledge of head and neck cancer to help them stay informed.
- **HNCA Webinars and Annual Survivorship Symposium:** HNCA, in partnership with the American Head and Neck Society (AHNS), offers free online webinars throughout the year, featuring medical experts and survivor panelists, on a host of topics from dental care, managing side effects and the importance of nutrition. Each year, the AHNS/HNCA also hosts a Survivorship Symposium where patients, survivors and caregivers come together to share their experiences, learn from medical experts and one another, and advocate for one another.
- **HNCA Ambassador Program:** We strive to empower patients and survivors to share their journeys. Our Ambassadors, who are patients, survivors and/or caregivers, are dedicated to educating the community about these cancers. Their inspirational journeys give true meaning to what happens when you are diagnosed with cancer, during and post-treatment.

- HNCA Gas Card Program: Funded in part by our annual Smash Cancer Tennis Tournaments, HNCA offers a limited supply of \$50 gas cards to help patients cover the cost of transportation to their medical facility.
- Clinical Trials: HNCA provides resources that teach patients about the importance of clinical trials and what is involved in participating in a trial. Patients can use our resources and search our Clinical Trial Finder to guide discussion with your medical team about the best treatment option for you.
- Peer-to-Peer Mentorship Program: Through our partnership with Imerman Angels, we provide the opportunity for peer-to-peer support for the head and neck cancer community. Whether you are a patient, survivor, or careaiver, you can connect with someone to give or receive support.
